Bystander Training Workshops provide a lively introduction to safe and effective ways to take constructive action when:

- Someone you know personally, such as a co-worker, family member, or neighbor, says or does something bigoted, whether intentionally or unintentionally. What are some of the different ways you can respond?
- When you witness a stranger being the target of verbal abuse or prejudice (such as at the supermarket), how can you support the victim without escalating the situation?
- When you realize that your own ignorance or hidden bias has caused unintentional harm to others, what can you do?

The actors of the True Story Theater group have devised workshops utilizing a form of improvised story-telling to build trust and connection among people across differences. The workshop creates a safe container for participants to express strong feelings and bring issues alive. Through improvisation, the actors dramatize different scenarios and invite the audience to try out different possible interventions through role play and discussion. <https://truestorytheater.com/>
